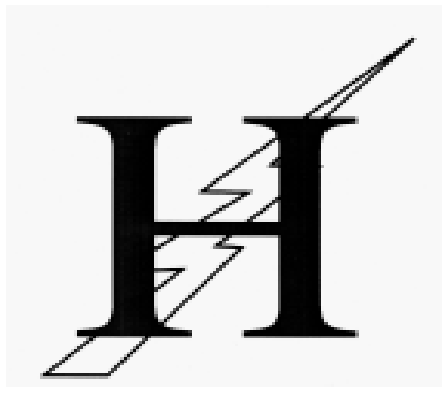

H COACHES

Keith Otterbein, Head Coach

Over the past three seasons, the Hillsdale College football team has been consistent, and head coach Keith Otterbein is determined to change that in 2005.

The Chargers have gone 4-7 in each of the three seasons Otterbein has been the head coach. In case he or his players forget about that record, they had T-shirts made up with those records printed on the front with the inscription "Ain't good enough."

Armed with the program's biggest senior class and largest roster in several years, Otterbein is determined to break that trend, and has spent the offseason leading his players and coaches in that upward direction.

"I think we went into last winter with a greater work ethic, and we've structured things so that we won't have any regrets come November," Otterbein said. "We want to be a tougher football team mentally and physically, and be accountable. Raise the bar a little bit."

Otterbein has certainly known a great deal of success throughout his playing and coaching career. And entering his 25th season of coaching the sport, he feels ready to put the many lessons and philosophies he's learned from his mentors to use for the Chargers.

Otterbein was a top-shelf linebacker for Hillsdale from 1975-79, earning NAIA Honorable Mention All-American honors after his senior season.

Otterbein, a proud three-time winner of the Plaid Open, has carried a winning mentality at every coaching stop he made, including his start in the profession, in 1980 here at Hillsdale.

After getting his feet wet in the profession, Otterbein moved on to Central Michigan University.

While coaching under legendary coach Herb Deromedi, Otterbein was able to learn the coaching ropes and establish a series of philosophies that serve him well to this day.

"One thing Herb told me was to write everything down. When you come to a gray area, refer back to that, those written philosophies you have. That's what you believe in," Otterbein said. "Over the years, maybe some of the X and O's stuff changes, but not why I entered the profession."

Otterbein maintains a strong belief in the kind of player he wants donning the Charger lightning bolt.

"We want our student-athletes to have academic success while learning many valuable lessons offered in intercollegiate athletics, so, 20 years from now, they're better prepared to be positive contributors to their communities."

He wants his players to earn a degree, represent the school in a first-class manner, and to contend for, and hopefully win, a GLIAC



championship, something that has eluded Hillsdale since 1992.

As he enters his fourth season at the helm of the Chargers, Otterbein can draw upon a wealth of coaching experience that has seen him enjoy tremendous success at several levels.

Otterbein's first head coaching stint started at Ferris State University in 1986, where he would spend nine win-filled seasons with the Bulldogs.

Otterbein won 60 games in his nine seasons at Ferris, including an impressive 30-4-2 mark in his final three seasons, 1993-1995. Thanks to that success, Otterbein was named the Midwest Intercollegiate Football Conference's Coach of the Year twice. He also led FSU to three straight trips to the NCAA Division II playoffs.

Otterbein moved on to join Bill Lynch's staff at Ball State University in 1996, where he helped lead the Cardinals to a Mid-American Conference title. He served as the Cardinals' recruiting coordinator and running backs coach through the 2001 season.

Otterbein's football career reached full circle, in a way, with his December 2001 appointment as the Chargers' head coach.

The GLIAC (the league the MIFC evolved into) changed much during Otterbein's time at Ball State. The league is now considered an elite one among the nation's Division II colleges. In 2004, four GLIAC teams finished ranked in Division II's Top 25, with three (Grand Valley, Northwood and Michigan Tech) all qualifying for the playoffs. That challenge, with tough teams all over the schedule, is one of the things that drew Otterbein to his alma mater.

"That's a big challenge, to find enough players who are good enough to play here, and who want to play at a small liberal arts college," he said. "When you look at this school, we have easy things to sell. We have a 99.5 percent job placement after graduation, and when you look at the kind of education we can offer, we know we are always going to work with a classy group of kids who will be competitive in this league."

In addition to his Coach of the Year honors, Otterbein netted several honors as a player. He was named a National Football Foundation Hall of Fame Scholar-Athlete. While at Hillsdale, he received the Ora C. Kimball Award for athletics, and the Leonard Urbanik Award for scholarship, leadership and ability. He also received the Ralph Miller award as the team's Most Valuable Linebacker three times.

Otterbein and his wife Amy have three children, all of whom are close to him and Hillsdale athletics in several ways. His son Steve (21) is a defensive back for the Chargers, and his daughter Alyssa (18) will be a freshman on Hillsdale College's softball team this spring. His youngest child, Brad (17), is entering his senior season at Hillsdale High School, where he is a standout football and an All-County baseball player.



H COACHES

Craig Blanchard, Defensive Coordinator



For many years of his football life, Hillsdale has been a rival of teams Craig Blanchard has been a part of. However, he enters the 2005 season carrying a bigger role on a Hillsdale team than ever before.

Blanchard takes over this year, as the Chargers' defensive coordinator, after spending four seasons as the team's defensive backs coach. He still carries the titles of assistant head coach as well as recruiting coordinator.

Blanchard played his high school ball at nearby Jonesville High School, where he led the state of Michigan in rushing as a senior in 1976. From there, Blanchard went on to play at Grand Valley State University, where he starred as a tailback and defensive back.

Blanchard netted First Team All-Conference honors for Grand Valley in 1979 and 1980, his final two seasons with the Lakers. He also led the team in interceptions both seasons.

Blanchard's first college coaching stint at Hillsdale occurred between 1982 and 1984, when he was the defensive backs coach under Dick Lowry. In his first season, his unit set a school record for interceptions in a season with 32.

Blanchard coached the defensive backs at Eastern Michigan University in the 1986 season before taking a similar position at Saginaw Valley State for six years.

Blanchard earned his bachelor's degree in 1981 from Grand Valley State. He resides in Hillsdale with his wife Melanie, who is a home health nurse at the Hillsdale Community Health Center. They have four children, Lauren (20), Kathryn (19), Michael (16) and Aaron (13). Lauren is a junior at Adrian College, where she plays softball. Kathy also plays softball, and will be a sophomore at the University of Indianapolis. Michael is a three-sport standout at Hillsdale High School, and Aaron is entering the eighth grade. He's also a three-sport athlete and an honor student at Davis Middle School.



Barry Fagan, Offensive Coordinator



From his days as a wide receiver at Penn State University, to his current position as offensive coordinator for the Chargers, coaching has been a love and passion for Barry Fagan.

Fagan's coaching career has had several stops, with a few of them coming in his current home conference of the GLIAC. He worked with head coach Keith Otterbein on successful teams at Ferris State University, and was the head coach at Wayne State from 1997-99.

While at Ferris in 1995, Fagan coached an offense that averaged 39 points per game and advanced to the Division II national semifinals.

He's also made coaching stops at the University of Wisconsin, Louisiana State University, Shippensburg (Pa.), Miami (Ohio) and Clarion University (Pa.).

But no matter where his career has taken him, the thrill of game day is a feeling Fagan feels just as intensely today.

"It's like a chess game," Fagan said. "You spend the week analyzing your opponent, and watching it come to fruition is just a great feeling."

Fagan first caught the coaching bug while attending high school in Pennsylvania. At Penn State, where he played from 1974-76, he learned under one of the best of all-time in coach Joe Paterno. Fagan played on three bowl teams at Penn State, but saw his playing career cut short by a knee injury, suffered before his senior season.

After graduating from PSU in 1978, Fagan immediately joined the coaching ranks, starting out as an assistant coach at Peters Twp. High School, where he remained until 1983.

Inbetween his college stops, Fagan spent the 1996 season as the head coach at West Bloomfield (Mich.) High School.

But out of all of his stops, Fagan said he takes as much pride in coaching at Hillsdale as anywhere he's been.

"It's a first-rate program all the way," he said. "You know you're going to be dealing with a high quality of kids who have good character and who are accountable. Having been a head coach and having worked with Keith before, I feel like I can give some insight and present some options to the program."

Barry and his wife, Amy, have one daughter, Maura.



John Lindley, Linebackers Coach



The newest addition to the Hillsdale College coaching staff is John Lindley, who steps in as the team's linebackers coach.

Lindley comes to Hillsdale after spending the 2004 season at Tiffin University as the offensive line coach.

In a coaching career that has spanned more than 20 seasons, Lindley is experienced at finding and coaching talent in the state of Michigan. Lindley has coached at Eastern Michigan and Central

Michigan Universities, as well as New Jersey City University. He also spent three years as the offensive line coach at Michigan Tech before going to Tiffin.

His respect for head coach Keith Otterbein, as well as the Hillsdale program, are the two things that drew Lindley to the job as Chargers' Linebacker coach.

"When my former teams played Hillsdale, they were always tough, hard-nosed guys," Lindley said. "I didn't know much about the school then, but I have since learned that my philosophy is very much in line with the school's. It's just a perfect fit."

When it comes to coaching his players, Lindley steps into a position that has been a marquee one for Hillsdale in recent years.

Rob North, a 2004 graduate, and Josh Mott, a 2005 graduate, each were All-American selections either in pre-season or after the season. Both were linebackers and embodied that intensity Lindley wants his current players to bring to the field every day in practice.

"We will be known as the most aggressive linebackers in football," Lindley said.

Lindley received his bachelor's degree from Michigan Tech, and has a Master's Degree in Urban Education from Jersey City State College.

Lindley is single and resides in Hillsdale.

Nate Shreffler, Offensive Line Coach



It's not difficult for Nate Shreffler to remember what it was like to be a football player, or even a Hillsdale College player.

Shreffler, who enters his seventh season as the offensive line coach, played for the Chargers from 1989-1992, winning the conference's Special Teams Player of the Year honors in his final campaign. He was a part of the last Hillsdale team to win a league championship, and hopes he can lead a tough and experienced group to that same

promise land this year.

"I've always seen Hillsdale as a place I want to be, both as a player and as a coach," Shreffler said. "I understand what the kids go through and the demands placed on them. It helps both ways that I've been there. A lot of them even have the faculty members I did when I was here."

Shreffler has spent time coaching the game at many levels. After receiving his degree in secondary education from Hillsdale, Shreffler coached junior high football in Glendale, Ariz. before returning to the college game.

He served two years coaching the offensive line at Olivet College before returning to his alma mater, where players he's coached have enjoyed tremendous success.

In 2003, Shreffler helped guide First Team All-GLIAC lineman Silas Johnson to a spot in the Cactus Bowl, an all-star game for Division II players.

His offensive line also enjoyed a banner season in 2002, when tailback Kevin Clive finished first in the country in all-purpose yards and third in the nation in rushing.

Shreffler and his wife, Jill, reside in Hillsdale with their daughters Emma, Sarah and Grace.



H COACHES

Jeffrey Phelps, Defensive Line



Jeffrey Phelps knows what it's like to play behind a defensive line. Now, he's entering his third season coaching that position with Hillsdale College.

Phelps played his college football at Ball State University, where he starred as a linebacker and first met coach Keith Otterbein.

Phelps' 1996 Cardinals team won the Mid-American Conference title and played in the Las Vegas Bowl. That shared success with Otterbein helped lead Phelps to Hillsdale.

"He is always consistent. Hard-nosed, no-nonsense kind of guy," Phelps said of Otterbein.

While at Ball State, Phelps was a two-time All-Mid-American Conference player and was team captain as a senior in 1997.

Phelps worked for TEKsystems, a division of Aerotek Contract Sales for a little more than a year before returning to Muncie to acquire his Masters of Arts degree. Phelps got his first opportunity to coach along side Otterbein when he was the Cardinals' graduate assistant in 1999.

Phelps joined the coaching staff at DePaw University, a Division III program in GreenCastle, Ind., where he helped the Tigers to the 2000 Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference co-championship. Phelps coached the running backs at DePaw for two seasons before becoming the linebackers coach for the 2002 season.

In the spring of 2003, Phelps was reunited with Otterbein at Hillsdale. Phelps said his background as a player at the linebacker position helps his current task of coaching the Charger defensive linemen.

"If you coach any position in football, it helps you at all others," Phelps said. "On defense, you have 11 parts all coming together in a gap-control defense. Because I played linebacker, I can talk passionately with our linemen about defending their gaps for our linebackers."

Phelps said 2005 will be an exciting year because of all the experience this year's team has accumulated since Otterbein's arrival.

"This is coach's first senior class that he's recruited," Phelps said. "These guys have played a lot of football together and we want to send this senior class out with a taste of success."

Phelps is originally from Chicago, where he graduated from Crete-Monee High School in 1994. He is the son of Veatrice Phelps and the late Price Robert Phelps Jr.

Last season, Willson guided freshman kicker Matt Menchinger, who kicked a 58-yard field goal against Wayne State in a 40-34 victory on Oct. 12, 2002. Menchinger's field goal came just four yards shy of Chester Marcol's 62-yard school record field goal.

Willson has been a member of the college since 1975. He holds a bachelor's degree from Hobart College (1962),

Master's from Wyoming (1964) and Doctorate from Syracuse (1969). Willson and his wife Helen reside in Hillsdale.

Joe Williamson, Wide Receivers



Joe Williamson is entering his second season as an assistant coach for the Chargers, working primarily with wide receivers.

Williamson is no stranger to Hillsdale as he served as a student assistant coach for the past two years while finishing his education degree in 2003.

Jackie Knight, who was promoted to head athletic trainer in June of 2004, is beginning her third year overall with the Charger football program.

Knight previously served as the assistant athletic trainer at Hillsdale in 2002-03 and the interim head trainer this past season in 2003-04.

Prior to Hillsdale, Knight was a graduate assistant trainer at Indiana State University from 2001-2002, where she earned her Master's Degree in athletic training.

Knight also served as a student trainer and head equipment manager at Olivet College (1996-2001), where she received her bachelor's degree in 2001.

While at Olivet, she was a member of the softball team and earned First Team All-Conference honors as a first baseman.
