DR. MIKE KOVALCHIK is responsible for all athletic events at Hillsdale College. A graduate of Eastern Illinois University, he holds master's degrees from Eastern Illinois and State College of New York at Cortland and a doctorate from Southern Illinois University. Dr. Kovalchik is also a Vietnam veteran. He is married to Sheila Wallace-Kovalchik.

## Dr. Larry Arnn Hillsdale College President

The 12th president of Hillsdale College, received his B.A. in Political Science and Accounting in 1974 from Arkansas State University. He studied at the Claremont Graduate School and received his M.A. in Government in 1976 and his Ph.D. in Government in 1985.

Dr. Arnn is a director of the Henry Salvatori Center of Claremont McKenna College, of the Americans Against Discrimination and Preferences, of the Center for Individual Rights, of St. Mark's Episcopal School, and of the Claremont Institute. He recently was appointed to the Congressional Policy Advisory Board which provides counsel to the House Republican Policy Committee.

Hillsdale's new president was also the Founding Chairman of the California Civil Rights Initiative, or Proposition 209 on the November 1996 ballot. He and his wife, Penelope, have three children, Henry, Katy, and Alice.





## **Head coach Sunny Jones**

Sunny Jones, who started her appointment on July 1, 2004, begins her second season as head softball coach at Hillsdale College. Jones' competitive fire and energy helped lead the Chargers to another level of competitiveness in the ever-tough GLIAC in 2005.

Jones previously coached at Concordia University in Ann Arbor, where she served as the interim head coach/assistant coach from 2002-2004. While at Concordia, she was responsible for all aspects of the team, including recruiting, fundraising and game management. Jones also served as the lead hitting instructor for the Doug Gillis Pitching School and Softball Academy where she taught 8-18 year olds the fundamentals and techniques of hitting. She was also the head varsity coach at Novi High School from 2000-2003.

Jones is no stranger to the GLIAC after playing four years at Ashland University. While at Ashland, she was named a First Team All-American four times (1996-1999) and the Division II National Player of the Year as a senior in 1999. She was a finalist for the Honda Woman of the Year award in 1999 and was also invited to compete in the 1998 Olympic Festival.

In addition, she was named the GLIAC Player of the Year in 1996 and 1997. Following her collegiate career, Jones played professionally for the Akron Racers of the WPSL (1999). Jones, who graduated in 2000 with a physical education degree from Ashland, currently resides in Jackson with her husband, Eric.

## **Assistant coach Amy Paling**

Amy Paling makes the moves from player to coach in 2006, becoming Sunny Jones' assistant coach after her graduation from Hillsdale College in 2005.

Paling played softball for the Chargers for four years, and was a steady outfielder throughout her career. She was named honorable mention All-GLIAC after the 2005 season. Paling is pursuing a master's degree in sports administration from Bowling Green State University.

Paling attended Wayne Memorial High School where she was an All-County player for the Zebras.

## Hillsdale seeks next step forward in Jones' second season

Anytime you have a first-year coach at the college level, the adjustment time for player and coach alike can sometimes have negative consequences when it comes down to playing games. That wasn't the case a year ago for Sunny Jones and the Hillsdale College softball team.

Jones took over the Charger program in 2005, and produced a 22-19-1 campaign in her first as a collegiate head coach, coming after the Chargers were picked to finish eighth in the league in the GLIAC preseason poll. With a young roster on her hands, Jones did an excellent job of turning the team into winners, especially at home.

Hillsdale went 12-4 at Johnny Williams field last season, and ended up with a 10-8 GLIAC record. With many of those key players back, as well as the program's biggest freshman class in many years, hopes are high of postseason success in a season where Hillsdale is the host school of the GLIAC Tournament in Midland.

The Chargers' strength begins on the pitching mound, as junior Amy Whaley and sophomore Aimee Genter return this season after combining to win all 22 ballgames for Hillsdale last season.

Junior co-captain Jamie Meyers leads the offense, coming off a season where she hit better than .300. Junior catcher Ashley Wolff had an outstanding 2005 season, hitting .264 while being named First Team All-GLIAC. Wolff is part of a formidable battery, whoever the pitcher may be, for the Chargers.

Seniors Abby Daubenmire and Kaci Jagutis lend a lot of experience to the infield and outfield, respectively. Jagutis is a four-year starter, and will move to centerfield this season.

Sophomore Katie Botsis figures to play a significant role on the infield. She brings toughness and a wide variety of skills to the team.

A group of eight freshmen join the program this season, one of the biggest classes in the team's history. Pitchers Jamie Vandenburg, Kayle Stevenson and Ellen Eldridge lead a group that has complementary skills.

Dana Gould, Katelin Simon, Britt Sevey and Brecken Libbe will be the first-year players roaming the outfield. Libbe is a transfer player from Bowling Green State University, the only transfer player on the Chargers' roster.

Monica Mix and Alyssa Grewcock will be the

first-year players in the infield rotation. Erin Agency also returns to the outfield.

This marks the second year the GLIAC Tournament will be held in Midland. Until 2004, the GLIAC held the postseason tournament at rotating sites throughout the conference. But now, Midland is the permanent home of the GLIAC Tournament, with different schools rotating the hosting rights. Hillsdale holds that distinction this year.

Anne Marie Gappa-Robb was elected to Hillsdale College's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004. She was a four-time All-GLIAC pitcher and threw five no-hitters in her career.





The Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) is Michigan's largest collegiate league, with 14 members. It was started in the fall of 1972 and since has grown to include more than 100,000 students and 350,000 alumni.

Recently, four out-of-state schools joined the GLIAC ranks: Ashland University in Ashland, Ohio; Gannon University and Mercyhurst College in Erie, Pennsylvania, and Findlay University in Findlay, Ohio.

The league's charter members are Grand Valley, Ferris State, Lake Superior, Northwood Institute and Saginaw Valley. Oakland University was added in 1973, Hillsdale in 1974, Wayne State in 1975 and Michigan Tech in 1979. Northern Michigan replaced Northwood in 1986, and Northwood rejoined the GLIAC at the beginning of the 1993-94 season.

Points earned for league athletic championships are counted in competition for the President's Cup, given for athletic supremacy in the GLIAC each year. Each season, the conference hosts a softball tournament, which now has a permanent home in Midland, Mich. Hillsdale College will act as the host school for the 2006 GLIAC Softball Tournament.
